I'm currently studying exceptions in C++. In one of the examples, they're using what is considered bad practice in C++. This is code that they are using, where pointer x and *x are accessing a null pointer, and also where exception handling is not used, and this is being used in their demonstration of exceptions. `int main() { int *x = NULL; x = 5; }` I want to know why this is considered bad practice, because it seems very useful and good to have a null pointer and for accessing it to result in an exception. I would like to know how the code above is considered to be bad practice, and what exactly is meant by this. I have searched through and read the stack overflow questions about "returning null pointer" or "returning null object" and some of the answers about "returning null pointer" being bad practice for some reason, but I don't get it. Can someone please explain to me why this is bad practice and why it's bad practice? A: C++ does not have the concept of "null pointer" nor does it have the concept of "returning null pointer". You should think of C++ as an OO language first, and only afterwards a "language without pointers". It is considered bad practice because: Accessing a null pointer is undefined behavior, and Undefined behavior can be undefined in terms of what happens and who gets to know. A: Undefined Behavior means that anything can happen - including nothing. Accessing a null pointer is undefined behavior. Thus anything can happen. It could crash, it could do nothing, it could make the variable "not be null". It doesn't have to crash, and you can write code that doesn't crash, but does undefined behavior. Sometimes the compiler is smart enough to eliminate the crash, and sometimes it isn't. When you use undefined behavior, you need to be careful 2d92ce491b
